

7. WHERE OUR CLUBS PLAY



SSHA Clubs play in many Sydney wide competitions and leagues

Sydney South Hockey Association Clubs have teams in the Sydney Masters Hockey Association's Masters League and Legends competitions, Sydney Hockey Association's Premier League & Sydney League, Sydney Women's Hockey League' Metropolitan League & Masters competitions, Sydney East Hockey Association's Women's Premier, Women's & Junior competitions, North Area Junior Hockey competition as well as our local Marang competition.

8. PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The long awaited opening of Marang Hockey Complex was the highlight for Sydney South Hockey in 2018. There were tense moments for the Board during the week leading up to season start with no security of access and time running out to move in and prepare for play on Friday night and the opening on Saturday morning. But it happened and I thank the small group of Board members and their partners for what they were able to achieve in a short period of time to ensure the complex was ready. A special thanks to Carol as Facilities Director for the mammoth amount of time she has spent managing the daily operations of Marang.

As of writing this report the Association has a sublease with Sutherland Shire Council to occupy Marang. Once the land is handed over to the Council we will negotiate on a Lease. The time frame is still unknown as negotiations continue between Council and the landholders.

During the year I have been most encouraged by the number of positive and helpful volunteers who have a keen interest in ensuring success of the facility and strengthening hockey within our local area. Growing our local competitions is key to maximizing use of the facility and I encourage anyone who has an interest in establishing a comp or running an event to contact the Association Secretary.

Congratulations to all our Sydney South representatives this year. It has been a most outstanding and memorable year, with the number of State Championship wins and NSW and Australian representative selections. Take the time to read about our fabulous reps, coaches and officials in this Annual Report.

I thank the Board for what they have been able to achieve this year. It has not been easy for the 4 members experiencing their first year on the board and the other 4 taking on new roles. Added to this the extra demands of running a Hockey facility for the first time. Carol, Scott and myself have now served on the board for 4 years and may only stand for one more year. The Association needs the support of the Hockey community to fill any vacated roles in the year to come.

It is important that we celebrate and keep a record of what happens each year, the Annual Report is so valuable as a history of the Association. I thank all who have taken the time to contribute this year and to Lee our secretary for the many hours spent chasing up and putting this report together.

Finally and on a personal note it was so pleasing to see a women's competition again based in the Shire and to have all our junior competitions on a top quality pitch at a similar time each week. I would hope in the near future we are able to run a local comp for our older boys and a social men's competition enticing back some ex-players and their mates to the life time sport of hockey.

9.1. Finance Report

The 2018 Finance Report has yet to be audited and has not been included in this report.

9.2. Competitions Report

The long awaited opening of the Association fields coincided with the 2018 winter season start. Extra games were scheduled to ensure all local teams had the opportunity to play on the new surface.

The junior winter season included mixed modified U7's, U9's, U11's, full field mixed U13's and Open Girls competitions. A women's competition was also run for the first time in some years. Four women's teams competed in the inaugural Marang comp, using a 9 a-side format.

The Summer Indoor competitions were again run at Port Hacking High for senior women and mixed Juniors.

Added to the calendar for this year- a six weeks half-field Family competition and a 12-week Women's half-field competition both held at Marang.

9.3. Facilities Report

6th April, 2018 – a Friday night to remember for all those people from Sydney South Hockey Association who worked for so many years to get our very own turf complex up and running. Sincere thanks must go to our original 'Turf Team' of Bernie Riordan, Mick Clift and Brad Fussell for getting the funding and original idea and plans before Council. Teresa, our then-President, and I came on board some 8 years ago and took over the task of steering progress in what we hoped was the right direction. Although at times we had our doubts! Teresa's dedication and determination to get this project completed was paramount to our success, and hockey in the Shire is greatly indebted to her.

It was therefore very exciting to be present on the 6th to welcome the Sutherland U15 and U17 Metro A teams to their first 'home' games, and have our Open Schoolgirls back in the Shire after spending several years as nomads on Fridays and Sundays.

Saturday 7th April was the official opening, organized in conjunction with Sutherland Council. At the same time the fields previously known as 'Greenhills' were given their official name of Marang Parklands Hockey Complex. It was great to see so many people there — many life members, past players and present players from the SEHA and Moorebank competitions as well as all our junior and senior players in our own new competition.

In the afternoon we also saw the brief return of some old Sydney South first grade teams, playing in the Premier grade of SEHA. We are working closely with the committee from SEHA to try and give the local teams more 'home' games in 2019.

As with many new facilities, we had our fair (some would say unfair) share of teething problems, not the least of which was a blocked sewer. Vicki, Lyn, Angelo and Jeff Davis were very instrumental in getting this and other problems sorted. Along the way a number of people have played a very large part in maintaining our facility and keeping the wheels of competition rolling. Apart from board members Lyn, Lee, Vicki and Scott, Ron and Ken did all those little (and some

not so little) jobs that no one ever notices until they go wrong, and Jeff was kept busy adjusting the guns for watering the fields and keeping an eye on all things electrical. Janice and Nathan also more than pulled their weight throughout the year ensuring the fixtures and umpiring ran smoothly.

One of our major challenges was sourcing outside users of the fields, at times that didn't clash with our own competitions. We were able to work with SEHA in getting the Sutherland U15 and U17 teams in the SEHA competition playing at Marang on Friday nights, on an almost home and away basis, which hopefully can be expanded next year. They also made several bookings for their Premier/1st grade games when other venues were unavailable and this also will be expanded in 2019.

Tartans entered their first ever men's team in the SHA competition, and again we were able to name Marang as their home ground, which saw them playing there on a home and away basis on a Saturday afternoon, after our competition games had been played. SHA also used Marang on a number of occasions throughout the year to accommodate teams other than Tartans, so our reputation as a top facility with the best playing surface was spread across the metropolitan area.

Our first major event was held on 19, 20 and 21 June, when we hosted the CHS State Championships. This went off very well, in spite of the heaviest rain in years on day 2 which resulted in a shorter playing day, and lower canteen takings. A very steep learning curve was involved, and a huge effort from Lee and Vicki, also Steph Flynn who supplied the best ever cakes and scones. Life members Sylvia Brennan and Lawrie Daly rolled up their sleeves for two days in the canteen and on the BBQ, along with Jenny MacGregor and Jenny Palmer, who took leave from work to come and help. We need more players and parents like these people to work with the Board to make the future of Marang and local hockey secure.

During the year, Marang has also been used by Sydney East PSSA Boys and Girls for training, the NSW State U21 Women's and Men's Blues teams for training, the Accelerated Athlete Program and Centre Of Development, Primary Schools knockout competition, U11 Training and Development, run by Justine, local Catholic Schools hockey on Friday afternoons and the majority of our rep teams have trained there prior to their State Championships. In addition, our Regional Coaching Coordinator, Alan Charlton, has also run a number of coaching clinics throughout the year. All of these 'outside' users have commented on the quality of our facility, and the State teams particularly said how good the playing surface is.

As the winter season ended, our Thursday night Summer Family competition started, and ran for 6 weeks, followed by our women's 6-a-side mid-week competition, running from 26th September until 12th December.

A working bee was held on 20th October which was well attended by several clubs and covered all things from gurneying the building, to overhauling the BBQ, to weeding the large grass surrounds and cleaning the canteen, change rooms, toilets and dugouts. This will be an ongoing commitment for all clubs in order to maintain our facility at its best.

On 29th October the fields were cleaned for the first time since the competition started in April. It was pleasantly surprising to find they were not as full of sand, grit and general dirt as we anticipated, given the almost constant winds blowing across the fields from the tip.

Following a meeting with the management of Breens, we were very pleased to learn that they would be sponsoring us to the sum of \$5,200 this year, and would renew that sponsorship in 2019.

I have mentioned a number of people in this report for their on-going work and support in our first year of operation, but there have been many more people doing their bit each week to keep our competitions running — moving the goals for our U7 and U9 teams, working in the canteen and on the BBQ, umpiring and doing tech bench duty, coaching and managing our junior teams. To all of you, thank you for your support. This is my first and last report as Facilities Director, as I will be overseas next year and not able to give the position the attention and energy required. Whoever takes over will need not only your continued support but a growing base of people working to expand our competition to fully utilize this wonderful facility called Marang.

9.4. Game Development Report

Our Regional Coaching Coordinator Alan Charlton has been very busy this year running seasons for our Clubs, Coaches and players. We thank him very much for his dedication and support of Sydney South.

Alan also ran 2 Holiday Clinics for the U12's with over 30 kids attending each event. Centre of Development (COD), Athletes Acceleration Program (AAP) and Sporting School's Programs are also part of Alan's Activities and he has a number of other new initiatives planned for the off season to ensure our kids are skilled up and ready to go in 2019.

9.5. Marketing & Communications Report

The year had many opportunities for promoting Sydney South, our clubs and players. There were six Sydney South teams winning State Championships, 2 Play the Whistle Award winning teams, numerous players selected for NSW and Australian teams, the opening of Marang Parklands Hockey Fields, new competitions established and our clubs having success in competitions across Sydney.

These types of opportunities allow us to promote the sport on social and traditional media as well as to increase our profile with Hockey NSW, local politicians and Sutherland Shire Council.

Social Media

Our social media presence continued to grow.

The number of users liking our Facebook page (@sydneysouthhockey) increased by 17% from 527 at 1 October 2017 to 619 by 30 September 2018.

Over the year, we made 272 posts to the page. In total these posts received 7,643 likes, 724 comments and 439 shares. On average these figures were 28, 5 and 3 respectively. The average Reach of the posts was 434 while average Impressions was 795.

Our Instagram page (sydneysouthhockeyassociation) was launched late in the year and we have made 15 posts and currently have over 100 followers.

The Twitter account (@sydsthhockey) was not used during the year.

Marang Parklands Hockey Fields were set up on Google Maps to enable people to find the fields and to contact us.

Traditional Media

The Leader published 6 stories over the year directly relating to Sydney South Hockey Association including:

- Under 13 national title to Kian Johnson (2 February)
- Seven under 15 boys and girls selected in NSW teams (19 March)
- Four under 18 girls playing for NSW at nationals (29 March)
- Marang Parklands Hockey Fields opening (9 April)
- Under 15 girls winning NSW State Championships (31 May)
- Open Mens winning NSW State Championships (14 June)

Post the end of the Association's year, The Leader has published 2 stories:

- Under 15 girls winning Indoor State Championships (24 October)
- Under 13 Girls winning Indoor State Championships (15 November)

Other mentions during the year included a reference to the Under 18 boys winning State Championships (15 May) in an article on Sutherland Hockey Club Premier League team. This resulted in information being sent to The Leader to explain the difference between club and Association.

Sutherland Hockey Club also had many mentions of team results in the Sydney men's competition while Tartans Hockey Club had a story published about the grand final win of that club's inaugural men's team.

We now have good contacts with The Leader journalists and will look to continue to provide them with relevant information for potential stories.

Following the end of the Association's year, we were approached about being involved in the 2SSR-FM community radio sports program *Sideline Eyes*. An interview was recorded with Stingray representative player Zoe Newman about her success and experience playing and coaching hockey. Zoe was an excellent interviewee and ambassador for Sydney South.

We will look to take advantage of this program in the coming year to increase our reach in the community.

Grants

Over the financial year, a number of grant applications were submitted. We were successful with some, others remain outstanding and we missed out on a few.

The successful grants received in the financial year were:

Tradies: \$6,000 to support our representative program via Club Grants

Tradies: \$6,435 for the purchase of a set of goals at Marang Parklands via Club Grants

Office of Sport: \$5,500 for the purchase of a set of goals at Marang Parklands via Local Sport

10. CLUB REPORTS

10.1. Bosco Hockey Club

10.4. Sutherland District Hockey Club



2018 was another excellent season for Sutherland Hockey Club, with notable achievements both on and off the field. In terms of playing results:

A SEHA Major Club Championship for our senior women's teams – congratulations ladies! 3 of our 4 ladies teams made finals, with 1 team (3rd grade Wildcats) getting through to the grand final.

A dominant year for our junior teams, with 11 of 12 teams making finals, 9 of those teams reaching grand finals, and 6 winning premierships: u17 Metro and SEHA Premierships in u17, u13A, u13B, u11A and u11B competitions

5 of our 7 senior men's teams made SHA finals, with 3 teams (4th, 5th and 6th grade) all making grand finals, alas none secured a premiership trophy. Our 1st grade men's team in the Sydney Premier League 1 competition had a superb season, missing the Minor Premiership only on goal difference. Unfortunately a poor game in the preliminary final cost them a spot in the Grand Final.

From a playing numbers perspective, we fielded 7 men's teams (an increase of 1 on 2017), 4 senior women's teams (an increase of 1 from 2017), and 12 junior teams (no change from 2017). The increase in senior playing numbers behind these extra teams was a positive sign!

Our Club also conducted the annual u11 Herb Fibbins Association Carnival for 16 u11 Association teams, our Term 3 Primary Schools Gala Day, and also ran our Term 4 Tradies 6-a-side Summer Schools Hockey competition – the latter involving 48 teams from local primary and high schools.

Representation in Association, State and Australian teams from our Club was again very strong, headed by Kieran Govers in the Kookaburras and Jack Hayes in the Australia A Men's team, along with Naomi Duncan and Grace Young in the Australian u18 Youth Olympic Team. We had 9 further players selected in NSW u21 and junior representative teams, plus 1 Australian Masters rep. Just as importantly, we had a very long list of junior players involved in Association representative teams participating at State Championships (both field and indoor), which has been terrific for their hockey development.

Administratively, we have been quite occupied with work preparing for the resurfacing of our home field at Sylvania Hockey Park – which is now scheduled to occur over the summer. Aside

from a \$20K NSW Government Grant through Eleni Petinos, State MP for Miranda, the remainder of the funding for the \$350K project has been raised by our Club and our supporters, which constitutes a huge investment by a community sports club in local infrastructure for hockey.

Finally, the long awaited opening of the two new fields at Marang Parklands, Greenhills, means there are now three top class water base hockey fields in the Shire. Such a change will hopefully be transformative for not only the Sydney South Hockey Association and its member clubs, but also for the sport of hockey in the Sutherland Shire. It's an enormous opportunity!

Unfortunately, we went down again in another close game 2-0. Our Sunday night game was against Sapphire Coast for a place in the final. In a fluctuating game we went down 1-0, with the goal being scored from a penalty corner played out after time. We then had a consolation game against Canberra Yellow on Monday afternoon. With a couple of injuries we played in many different positions and finished strongly with a 4-1 win.

The girls came together really well as a team for a most enjoyable carnival. It was great to see the more experienced players interact with and support the younger less experienced girls. We were able to get in 3 training sessions before we went away and this helped with team bonding and structured play. I hope the girls will all return to representative hockey with Sydney South in 2018. Thank you to the Association for supporting this concept in 2018. I recommend that a similar team attend this carnival again in 2019.

Of course, these teams cannot work without the support of the parents. All the parents who were able to be there on the weekend supported the team in a positive manner and put their hands up to help out wherever needed. I also cannot give enough thanks to our wonderful manager, Michelle Druery. She supported me in the dugout as a great sounding board, she ran the substitutions and managed to treat injuries, disappointments and manage successes at the same time. Our first game was against Grafton, a team that looked to be our toughest opponent in our Pool. We knew a good start to the tournament was essential – and a win over Grafton would certainly put us in a great position. We hoped the extra cold weather might affect Grafton more than us! Unfortunately we came away with a 2-4 loss and plenty to think about. A few lapses at crucial stages (especially the last 5 minutes of the first half when Grafton scored twice) were costly in an otherwise "good" performance.

Parkes were our 2nd opponent on Day 1, and whilst they weren't the same challenge as Grafton, we weren't going to be gifted a win. Fortunately our first half was excellent and we went in at the break with a 3-0 lead and looking very much in control. With a few key position changes we lost the plot comprehensively in the 2nd half, and in the end we hung on for a 3-2 win. Lesson learned!

The aim on Day 2 was to fine tune our game, and of course get two essential wins and a decent "for and against" to ensure our spot in the semi-finals. Perhaps we might also sort out our penalty corners!

We started with Illawarra South Coast 2, and defeated them 6-0, playing a terrific brand of counter attacking hockey. It looked like our midfield and attack was really starting to gel. We followed up that night with a game against the home team Bathurst. This was a very tough and hard game, probably our best to date, and the 3-0 win was very encouraging.

We had comfortably secured 2nd spot in our pool (behind Grafton, who had gone through their pool games undefeated). We now faced up to Newcastle 2 in the semi-final — at the uncomfortable hour of 8am on Sunday - for a spot in the final.

As in any competition, everyone lifts their intensity when it comes to finals – and the story was no different here. The semi-final encounter with Newcastle 2 was a nail biter to the end. We needed a win to go through, a draw would not be enough (given Newcastle finished 1st in their pool). We played most of the game at 1-1, then less than 2 minutes from full-time the breakthrough came with Matt Staples on hand at the far post to confidently put the ball into the net and send us through to the final.

Grafton had a fairly comfortable 3-0 win in their semi-final, and so the stage was set for a Grafton v Sydney South rematch in the Div. 2 final. This game was a fantastic display of u18 hockey from two teams who would clearly not be out of their depth in Div. 1. Again we played most of the game at 1-1, and again the decider came in the final few minutes — this time Matt Staples delivered a searching cross from the left (a stunning toma on the run) and Nic Donni at full stretch deflected the ball passed the keeper into the net. I think I only relaxed when the clock was down to 2 seconds to go and we had the ball in hand!

The positive attitude and effort from every player was a great foundation. We had 14 fit players into the final games, which doesn't always happen in the cauldron of State Championships. In terms of performance, every player delivered — and many showed significant improvement. Above all they did what all successful teams do — they worked effectively together and supported each other.

Subsequent to the Championships, Harry Roberts and Matthew Turner were named in the 2018/19 AAP Squad, which is the training squad from which the 2019 u18 State Teams will be selected. In addition Mitch Shipp, team captain, was presented with the Hockey NSW Citizenship Award for his good sportsmanship and conduct at the Championships.

Just three of this year's team (Damon, Mitch and Ryan) have completed their time in u18s, so we have a great base of players to work with in forming our team for entry into Div. 1 in 2019!








SSHA Age and Gender Distribution

JENOLA OPENS FOR BUSINESS - 11 APRIL 1942

With the Association shortly to leave Jenola after 70 years what was it really like on the first day of 'official' hockey way back in 1942?

In 1942 Australia was facing its greatest crisis. In New Guinea Australian servicemen were fighting a campaign more important than Gallipoli....a desperate struggle to save the homeland from the might of Imperial Japan. Seaside suburbs like Cronulla anticipated attack and possible invasion. Barbed wire and huge concrete blocks covered the beaches and some local areas were "Off limits" to civilians

In these grim times the Cronulla Section of the NSW Women's Hockey Association commenced its inaugural season at Jenola

In 1942 the Gannons Road ground consisted of one mown field running east west across what are now the No 2 and No 3 fields. It was not the lawn we now enjoy. Doug Burrell's Laundry business in Denman Avenue behind the railway line served as the dressing sheds.

A Gala Day opening was held on Saturday 11th April. This featured a spectacle of women's sports, good weather and a large crowd including six of the nine Shire councillors.

The 'Cronulla Observer' reported the event as follows:

"With the variegated colours of the tunics of the various teams we saw a pageant of skill and beauty that was so colourful that it was truly a wonderful spectacle".

The same reporter saw the day as a triumph for women's sport:

"...our girls were at last taking a place in sport in this district where masculine sport has so largely dominated".

Celebrities who performed on the day included Miss E. Soult NSW High Jump Champion (who jumped to a height of 5 feet (1.5 m) and women's state discus and sprint champions.


In the feature hockey match a combined Graduates Club/Sydney University defeated a Sutherland Selection 5 goals to nil.

Thus Jenola had begun its first official season of women's hockey and for some the whole event was uplifting as the 'Observer' reporter extolled:

"One visitor was heard to remark that at a time when the Government was closing and controlling drink and dance halls in the closer suburbs it was stimulating to one's morals to witness such a collection of girls participating in clean, open sport where their parents could witness and enjoy their pleasure."

The inaugural competition began on 23rd May with five teams, all bearing aboriginal names; Koonwarra, Mirrabooka, Nargoon, Larool and Yarrenbool. Many of the players were schoolgirls and a number had been recruited from the staff at Doug Burrell's laundry.

Each week the team with the bye travelled by train and tram to the Eastern Suburbs to play a team in the Woollahra section. Regular hockey had a home in the Shire.
